Why?

- Why was this originally written?
- Why would God include this in the Scripture?

For Application/Implication

- 1. What does this tell us about God's nature, ways, and priorities?
- 2. What is God doing for, promising, or commanding his people in this passage?
- 3. How is our situation similar to the original readers/hearers? How is it different?
- 4. What, then, is the principle, promise, or command for us in our time?
- 5. What does this mean for me today, right now?
